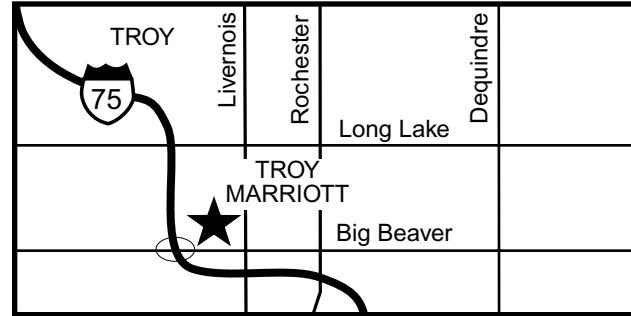

From the East Side – Take I-696 West. At I-75, go north. Exit Big Beaver Road (exit #69), follow East. Approximately 2 blocks up on the left.
