### **Armed Robbery Arrest**

**Somerset Collection, 2800 W Big Beaver, 5/27/12, 5:23 pm: Troy Officers were dispatched to a report of one woman and three men fighting inside the mall. As officers were responding, information was received that the incident involved some type of theft and that one suspect was fleeing the area in a white full-size van. Troy Officers located and stopped the van near Lakeview and Big Beaver. The lone male driver was taken into custody after a brief scuffle. Officers spoke with the victims who stated that they had just exited the True Religion store where the woman had purchased a pair of jeans and a shirt. As they walked away from the store, they noticed two men sitting on a bench outside the store. Suddenly, one of the men who had been seated on the bench grabbed the male victim and ripped his glasses off his face. The victim was wearing a pair of \$1,800 Cartier eyeglasses. As the male victim scuffled with his assailant the other man who had been on the bench pulled the revolver**

out of his front pants pocket while the assailant told him to “bust him”. The victim backed off after seeing the gun. Robertson then grabbed the woman’s purse and True Religion shopping bag and took off running. The couple followed the two suspects at a distance but lost sight of one. The other suspect was seen leaving in the white van. Troy Officers searched the white van and located a 6 shot revolver with five live rounds under the driver’s seat cushion. The female victim’s purse and True Religion shopping bag were also located in the van. The now broken Cartier glasses were recovered in the area where the confrontation had occurred. The second suspect was not captured and remains at large.

On 5/29/12 a warrant was obtained charging “Kereim Jwron Robertson”, 18 years old, out of Detroit with “2 Counts of Armed Robbery”, “Felony Firearm”, “Possession of a Firearm in Commission of a Felony” and “Resist and Obstruct a Police Officer”. He was arraigned by Judge Bolle of the 52-4 District Court and bond was set at \$1,000,000.00 cash/surety. Pre-Trial scheduled for June 4, 2012 at 8:30 AM in front of Judge Bolle.

## **Domestic / Family Trouble**

Troy Officers responded to 18 incidents involving domestic disputes or family troubles during this reporting period. On-scene investigation of 12 of the incidents did not result in evidence of crimes being committed; however, Officers were required to take non-enforcement actions to either mediate the situation or keep the peace

In five of the incidents Troy Officers arrested individuals for “Domestic Assault” and in one incident an arrest was made for “Domestic Assault” and “Malicious Destruction of Property”. Alcohol was a factor in two of the incidents. Two out of the six individuals arrested have a previous arrest for Domestic Assault.

## **One Citation Issued for Possession of Narcotic Paraphernalia**

### **One Citation Issued for Possession of Marijuana**

**I75 & Crooks, 5/26/12, 3:59 am: A vehicle was stopped after a Troy Officer observed it traveling at over 95 miles per hour and crossing over the lane markers. The vehicle smelled of intoxicants and marijuana. The driver was confused, had glassy/bloodshot eyes and dilated pupils. The 20 year-old male from Ferndale exhibited poor balance and was arrested. One pill which field tested positive for MDMA or Ecstasy was found in a pocket of the driver's shorts. He was charged with "Possession of Narcotics" and "Operating under the Influence of Drugs". A blood test was administered and results are pending.**

**I75 & Rochester, 5/27/12, 8:54 pm: Troy Police Communications received phone calls from two different people reporting a suspected drunk driver on I75. One caller reported that the car was in all three lanes and the driver was "drunk as a skunk". Troy Officers located and stopped the vehicle which was being driven by a 27-year-old Rochester Hills male. The man had poor balance and drug paraphernalia**

associated with crack cocaine use were found in the vehicle. When he was searched two pills identified as muscle relaxers were found in his pocket. He was arrested and charged with “Driving under the Influence of Drugs”. A blood test was administered and results are pending.

Fourteen Mile & John R, 5/29/12, 6:36 pm: A Troy Officer, working a grant funded “Seat Belt Enforcement Detail” stopped a vehicle for a seat belt violation. The driver provided the officer with his name and date of birth but when the officer ran that name through his in-car computer the Secretary of State photograph associated with that name did not match the man the officer had stopped. The man eventually admitted to providing someone else’s name because his license was suspended. He was in possession of over \$1,000 in cash and both cocaine and a portable digital scale were found in his car. The 37-year-old Dearborn man was arrested and a warrant is being sought for “Possession of Cocaine with intent to Deliver” and “Driving While License Suspended”.

The vehicle turned into a residential subdivision and continued to drive recklessly running the stop sign at Kristin and Jack. The car was stopped and the officer noted that the driver smelled of intoxicants and had glassy/bloodshot eyes. The 39 year-old Troy man apologized for driving recklessly. An investigation revealed the driver was intoxicated and he was arrested for "Operating While Intoxicated". Breath test results were .08%.

I-75 & Fourteen Mile, 5/26/12, 6:03 pm: Troy Officers were dispatched to the area after a citizen reported a suspected drunk driver swerving on I-75. A Troy Officer located the vehicle and observed it swerve over the lane marker. The vehicle was stopped and the 62-year-old male from Washington, Michigan failed sobriety tests and was arrested for "Operating While Intoxicated". Four empty beer cans were found in his vehicle. Breath test results were .19%.



## **Online Police Reporting Now Available in Troy**

The Troy Police Department has implemented an online police incident reporting system. A significant goal in this effort is to enhance our overall level of service by providing citizens the option and ability to file some of the more routine types of police reports conveniently online. Another goal is to optimize available time for police officers on patrol to more quickly respond to priority calls for service, detect and arrest individuals committing crimes, address traffic problems, and engage in other problem solving activities that enhance public safety. Often calls that are of a minor nature or are simply a request for a routine police report will find citizens waiting for what can be extended periods of time for a patrol officer to arrive due to the need to prioritize responses to more serious calls for service. Requiring citizens to come to the police department in person to file these types of reports can also result in the inconvenience of waiting in long lines. In the face of fewer officers on patrol, it is anticipated that the effective use of this system could potentially reduce overall response time associated with more serious incidents, as well as

## City of Troy Remains the Safest City in Michigan

On December 8, 2011, CQ Press released City Crime Rankings 2011-2012: Crime in Metropolitan America. CQ Press uses six crime categories to establish crime rate rankings for all cities with a population of at least 75,000 that report crime data to the FBI. The crime categories include: murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary and motor vehicle theft. The rankings in the CQ report are based upon data reported to the FBI for 2010.

According to the CQ report, Troy has the lowest crime rate ranking in Michigan for cities with a population of 75,000 or more. Nationwide, Troy ranked 19<sup>th</sup> for cities with a population of 75,000 or more. Troy was ranked as the safest city in Michigan 10 of the last 14 ranking periods, including the current one. Troy has achieved "Safest City" rankings as high as 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> in the United States, in 2006 and 2005, respectively. In fact, in other than 2009, when it ranked 38<sup>th</sup> overall, Troy has consistently ranked among the top 25 safest cities in the United States with populations over 75,000 since 1998.

There were no forcible rapes involving a stranger assaulting an unknown victim in 2010. Acts of criminal sexual conduct in Troy generally relate to incidents where one of the actors is a minor, complaints where incest or molestation by family members are alleged, or complaints of non-consensual acts between individuals who are acquainted with one another.

The Troy Police Department responded to a total of 35,018 incidents of all types in 2010. The Troy Dispatch center received approximately 173,000 incoming telephone calls in 2010, of which 40,335 were 911 calls. The department hosted 236 crime prevention and other safety programs in 2010, which were attended by 14,632 citizens. Additional workload statistics for 2010 are noted below:
